- ▲ Benefit for Special Olympics “Tip a Cop” Oct 13th from 11:00 am – 3 pm and 4pm-8pm at 117th and Canyon Red Robin location
- ▲ With Halloween coming up and school starting again be more aware of children out and about in the mornings and afternoons, especially as it gets darker earlier moving into fall and winter. Make sure to send kids out with cell phone, know their routes and where they are going. Curfew for kids under 18 is 12am-4am. Police will be out on Halloween keeping an eye out for troublemakers

7:25-7:50 pm Conversation with Sen. Mark Hass.

- - Discussed involvement on the University Governance Committee and answer questions from the NAC
- Sen. Hass gave a brief bio, talked about his focus on higher education, his focus in the coming election is to get more of our high school students to earn college credits while they are still in high school to help with college affordability. Answered questions on his advocacy for seniors.
- Advocating for Seniors – elder abuse cases, i.e. a woman cleaned out a old man's will, Sen. Took interest in elder abuse and helped to strengthen elder abuse laws, increased statute of limitations to make it a more punishable crime to create more of a deterrent.
- Healthcare savings, educational restructuring
- Mentioned Southridge Football game dedicated to Andrew Keller on Friday night. In support of naming the stadium after him – possible agenda item for next month

7:50 – 8:52 pm Old/New Business

- South Beaverton Forest Glen PUD and Subdivision – The Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on Sep 26th to consider this application
 - 82 Homes, 13.4 acres, concerns about increased noise and traffic in the neighborhood due to additional roads, concerns about wetland preservation (environmental studies) and traffic studies. NAC has the ability to appeal the development to help address

citizen concerns. NAC appeals have to present specific concerns, evidence to support concerns, we need proof of what we are saying, need information to back up claims, what is allowable traffic flow on a residential street?

- Concerns about wetlands – Wetland and Water delineations assessment- not a key wetland in the area, but the developer will preserve wetland area and build a park
- NAC suggesting to contact concerned neighbors to come to NAC meeting to discuss possible support
- Concern about the grade on streets in regards to water flow and erosion
- Ali Kavianian resigned as treasurer, and the NAC needs a replacement
 - Vote required for a new Treasurer, Alan volunteered for position, no other volunteers, Alan appointed to treasurer
 - Also encouraged NAC participation, on the board or otherwise
- Brainstorming sessions for first South Beaverton Block Party/Picnic
 - Anyone interested, please attend meetings or contact the NAC to find out more
- Possible clean up of corner of Brockman and Sorrento
 - Another green area down the street that a neighborhood association managers, city maintenance would be willing to help improve those areas
- Asked for suggestions on where to place NAC signs
 - Place on next agenda as a continuing item to find volunteers to place the signs out in high visibility areas within the NAC
- “Beaverton NOW” program on TV as an information source for Beaverton residents on Ch. 30
- Discussion of Clean up of the retaining wall on north side of Brockman Ave, wall is growing over with weeds, proposes a neighborhood project and possible use of matching funds
 - Potential discussion with maintenance manager for help with possible wall clean up
- Other Old/New Business
 - Informed attendees that a Fanno Creek Crossing signal on Hall Blvd is in the process of being discussed
