South Beaverton NAC Meeting

7:00-7:05pm – Introductions

7:05-7:20pm – TVF&R Report

- TVF&R introduces new lifesaving smart phone app.
- **Sign up for free for the new smart phone app – “Pulse Point”.** This new program started in early 2013 to allow people with CPR training to be available to help with a public cardiac arrest within ¼ mile of their location. A person that is signed up would be paged on their phone and would be notified as to the location of the person in need and the location of the nearest Automated External Defibrillator (AED) device within the ¼ mile radius.
- Pulse Point is only set up to help people in cardiac arrest within public areas. Volunteers signed up to help with Pulse Point will NOT be paged to help people in private residences.
- It has been shown that chest compressions and/or defibrillation can dramatically improve survival rates for a cardiac arrest patient. The survival rate drops 10% for every minute that goes by without CPR. The chances of survival after 10 minutes without CPR are not good.
- **Register your AED.** Any business with an AED can register it on the Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue website so it can be available in case of a sudden cardiac arrest within ¼ mile radius. Visit tvfr.com for more information.

7:20-7:30pm – Police Report

- The Beaverton Police Department Third Annual Police Service Awards and Volunteer Recognition Ceremony was held February 13th, at the Southwest Bible Church located on Murray Boulevard. Three officers were presented with the agency’s Lifesaving Medals: Officer Ken Magnus, Officer Jeff Flory and Officer Matt Cline.
- The Beaverton Police Department will be hosting a Luau Fundraiser for the Police Activities League (PAL) to support area youth on April 13th from 6:00pm-10:00pm at the Jenkins Estate located at 8005 SW Grabhorn Road (off of Farmington Road). The luau fundraiser features a silent auction, raffle and wine pull. Tickets are \$75.00 which includes the luau buffet dinner and beverage. - A NAC member discussed suspicious drug activity and speeding on his street. Citizens are encouraged to notify police of any suspicious activity by calling the non-emergency dispatch number at 503-629-0111.

7:30-8:15pm – Murray Scholls Library Branch Proposed Expansion

- The Murray Scholls Library branch is hoping to expand its operation by 5,000 square feet. The new space would include 3,000 square feet for a children’s area and 2,000 square feet of the current lobby area to become a new circulation area. They are hoping to have the new space open in the summer of 2014.

- This branch opened in June of 2010 with 6,000 square feet of space. This is the fastest growing library in Washington County and averages 13% growth each month compared to the previous year. This branch has a circulation of 750,000 items per year. The total circulation of the main library and the Murray Scholls library combined is 3 million items per year.
- The Beaverton Library Foundation is looking at a \$350,000.00 capital campaign for tenant improvements, new shelving, furniture, etc. The current space is leased and the city is expected to cover the rent.
- The Murray Scholls branch is expected to stay at the current location for at least 10 years. It is possible that it could move to a different location at some point. The cost of the non-moveable improvements (permanent walls, fixtures, carpet, etc) is estimated at \$100,000.00.
- The foundation is looking for volunteers to help with the campaign or to give of their time or money to help fund the project. Visit BeavertonLibraryFoundation.org for more information.

8:15-8:45pm – Old/New Business

- South Beaverton NAC has applied for matching funds from the city to start a book drive for Hiteon Elementary. A second set of matching fund applications is in process to provide scholarship opportunities for Southridge High School students upon completion of volunteer time within the community along with an essay outlining the volunteer work completed. Volunteers that would like to help on either project are encouraged to attend the next South Beaverton NAC meeting. Book donations can also be dropped off at the NAC meeting.
- South Beaverton NAC is looking for volunteers to help at the Beaverton Recycling Day event to be held on Saturday, June 1st, 2013 from 9am-2pm at the Westgate site (3950 SW Cedar Hills Blvd.). There are two shifts available. Shift 1 – 8am to 12pm. Shift 2 – 11am to 3pm. Sign-up sheets will be available at the next South Beaverton NAC meeting.
- A NAC member asked what the status is regarding the police department building location and the plan to move city hall to the south office building. How much will it cost the citizens to move or improve city hall and the police department facilities? What will city hall do about parking at the round? This is a potential topic for a future NAC meeting.
- A NAC member brought up the issue of flooding along Hiteon Creek. The city engineer had a report prepared last year for the assessment of Hiteon Creek and adjacent multi-use path from SW Tarpan Drive to Hiteon Park. One purpose of the assessment was to help provide possible scope of work for a project to improve the drainage and multi-use path but this work is not yet scheduled. This is a potential topic for a future NAC meeting.
