- TVF&R finished a two month trial of a mental health mobile response team in an effort to make sure people can get the help that they need and not take needless trips to the ER. They are trying to meet needs, create efficiencies and solve problems.

7:10 - 7:15 **Police Report**

- Officer Michael Smith told everybody about a car seat clinic at the Kuni Collision Center on May 18th, and at City Hall on June 1st and June 15
- Also on June 15th is a document shredding event at the techtronix parking lot at 10am. The event is first come first serve and once the shredding trucks are full they take off. The service is free but the Police ask that you bring canned food donation
- Bike Rodeo at Vose from 10am to 2pm on May 30th to get bike safety tips and rules
- Volunteer Victim Advocate program. 18 volunteers went through a 45 hour training course conducted by the Police. It was developed to provide volunteers who can respond to domestic violence calls. These are people who have gone through volunteer training from all different backgrounds and are able to respond to a call and provide resources and knowledge to a victim to provide assistance.
- May 20th – Sunday June 2nd Seat belt use campaign starts and looking for kids riding in the back of a pickup truck because it is against the law to ride in the bed of a truck if you are under 18 years of age.
- General reminder about safety and handgun safety. About three days ago there was an incident nearby where someone called and thought they had found a bullet hole in the side of their house. By talking to enough people the neighbors thought they heard something and it turns out someone had discharged a handgun that went through their wall and into a neighbor's house. Officer Smith reminded everyone to make sure you treat every gun as if it were loaded and to exercise proper gun safety

7:15 - 8:05 **City Update from the Mayor**

- Gave an update on the city and neighborhood, answered some questions from question cards dropped off at Ava locations and questions from residents.
- Someone asked if there are efforts in place to make traffic from Hwy 217 easier and the city is working with ODOT to make improvements
- It was asked that with the remodeling of the South Office building and requirements for parking how would the city account for the parking? The city took this into account and took a look at parking options and available areas for the parking. It looks like there will be adequate parking available for the renovation.
- Someone asked what a TIGER grant means Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery and why are there so many homeless in Beaverton. TIGER grants are what the federal government chose to call the program. There are many programs in place to try and help the homeless and homeless youth in Beaverton.
- Someone asked if there is a litter program in place. The answer is if you see a problem send an email to the city and they will take a look at the problem areas.
- They also wanted to know how streets are identified for work and that is handled by the public works department, who goes out and finds the problem areas to fix them.
- Someone said thank you for helping to fix up a path by Beaverton high school. There was an issue with a bike path that a resident had and it was quickly fixed. The Mayor said it that

it helps to fix a problem if the city knows about it so he encourages people to report problems.

- The code compliance department was complimented on their swift service.
