We would like to extend this invitation for you to exhibit your work at the Doll Gardner Gallery for a special exhibition "the World of Women," April 2012.

SHOW INFORMATION:

This show, scheduled to run though the month of April, invites artists involved in creating wall artwork that celebrates women and the feminine to submit jpegs of work

for jurying. Work does not need to be original (giclees accepted) however, all work needs to be available for sale. Work must be framed (or in the case of canvases, must have painted edges) and must have wires attached that are suitable for the weight of the piece (sawtooth hangers cannot be accepted. In addition, accepted artists may submit shrink wrapped unframed work which is kept as back stock and is displayed in a print bin on Sundays. All work is insured once hung.

JURYING:

To jury in to the show please submit 3 jpegs of work that will be for sale in the show with your name and the title of the piece as the file name. Subject matter can cover the gamut from intense to delightful. Work that honors life, nature, or the human spirit have been well received. Deadline is March 28th for submitting work.
