Chinese Brush Painting Workshop – Cindy Lommasson

Cindy Lommasson is pleased to offer the second quarterly workshop in Chinese Brush Painting at the Oregon Society of Artists, on Sunday, June 24, 2012, from 10-4. (Subsequent dates are September 16, and December 9.) Students in the June 24 workshop will learn the fundamentals of Xieyi, or freestyle, exploring subjects such as: sunflowers, grapes on the vine, frog and lily pads, and a seascape. All levels of painters, including beginners, are welcome.

The fees are \$95 per workshop. Students will be required to purchase their own supplies, or pay an additional \$20 to the instructor for materials to use during the workshop.
