Raffle Sales (5 teams of 2)

- Sell raffle tickets and record sales by bid numbers
- Sell tickets until sold out or at “last chance” beginning of live auction
- Return completed sheets to registration for data entry

Commemorative Photo Booth (4)

- Promote photo sales
- Assist photographer
- Upon completion of silent auction take list to registration for data entry

Silent Auction Tables (9)

- Monitor tables
- Answer guest questions
- Inform table Captains of items that are not ‘selling’ well
- When silent auction ends turn all bid sheets over (emcee will announce end)
- Do not allow guests to bid after closing
- After guests leave area, circle winning bidder
- Take one copy of sheet for each package to registration for data entry
- Leave the other copy of the bid sheet with the package
- Do not allow guests to take their items until they have their itemized receipt

Silent Auction Captain (3)

- Inform the emcee of items that aren’t being bid on so he can ‘sell them’

Silent Auction Breakdown (silent auction staff and other available volunteers)

- Move silent auction items to designated area for guest pickup
- Assist Nike staff with break down as needed

Live Auction Display (2)

- Knowledge about package displays
- Answer guests questions about items and how the live auction works
- Promote the items, get people interested in bidding
- Provide security for items on the live auction display table

Recorders (2)

- Record paddle warmer bids – by bid number

- Break down of signage
- General cleaning
- Other duties as assigned
- Check for left behind items
