Beaverton Arts Commission- Community Grant Program, Accepting Applications Now!

The Beaverton Arts Commission is proud to announce the addition of a grant program into its repertoire. Special thanks to the Beaverton Arts and Culture Foundation for providing this generous support.

The application process is now open and closes on Monday, March 25th. Grants are open to individual artists, arts/cultural groups, Beaverton schools, and social service agencies, religious organizations, or private businesses partnering with a not-for-profit arts or diverse cultural organization for a joint project. Beaverton Arts Commission Grant Program provides financial support for non-profit visual, written, and performing arts organizations who serve the Beaverton community. Applicants to this grant program can apply for activities or opportunities that address one or more of these five goals:

1. Bring people together by providing opportunities for all people to experience and explore art.
2. Create ways for people to celebrate cultural diversity through art.
3. Help local artists to have a voice and to thrive artistically.
4. Spur the development and stewardship of art.
5. Educate the community on the intrinsic and economic value of art.

All funded activities must take place between July 1, 2013 and June 30, 2014.

"Ikebana Design" – Special Artist Demonstration at Art On Broadway

Artist and designer, Myla Keller, will conduct a demonstration of “Ikebana Design” at Art On Broadway on Sunday, January 20, 2013, from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm. This demonstration in flower design and basic principles of art is free and open to the public. Ms. Keller has studied in the Saga and Sogetsu Schools of Ikebana and is credited to teach in Book One of the Sogetsu School, whereupon when students master the basic styles, they are encouraged to develop their own style.

Also this month, Art On Broadway Gallery challenged its award-winning local artists to create works in a 12”x12” format for the first display of the new year. Whether the artist works in glass, fiber, ceramics, jewelry, as a sculptor or painter – the artwork must be square. The exhibit dates are now through February 2, 2013.
