Call to Artists - 2013 Tualatin Hills Park & Recreation District's "Artists in the Parks" Contest

The Tualatin Hills Park & Recreation District (THPRD) and Beaverton Arts Commission (BAC) announce a collaborative call to artists for a new competition entitled, "2013 THPRD Artists in the Parks Contest."

The contest is open to all artists residing within Park District boundaries. The THPRD boundary map can be found at <http://www.thprd.org/> by rolling your mouse over "Am I in-district?" on the left margin and then choosing "Boundary Map" from the drop-down menu.

Visual artists are invited to submit their 2D artwork to be considered for use on the cover of THPRD's seasonal activities guides. Only artwork depicting elements from a THPRD park or facility will be considered.

Activities guides are created three times per year representing the following seasons: summer, fall, and winter/spring. These guides list all programs, events and activities the Park District offers each term and therefore are widely used.

Submission Guidelines

- Call Title: 2013 THPRD Artists in the Parks Contest
- Deadline to apply: Monday, July 29, by 11 p.m.
- Artists may submit up to four works for consideration
- All 2D medias are acceptable (photography, watercolor, oils, acrylics, prints, drawings, collage, digital art, etc.)
- Artists should consider submitting work that is reflective of the seasons represented with each activities guide. For the winter-spring guide, priority will be given to participants whose artwork incorporates both seasons within a single image
- Activities guides are portrait-oriented and are 8" w x 11" h

June Events at the Beaverton Historical Society

Monthly Presentations: Tuesday, June 11, 7-8pm: The Tualatin-Yamhill Peoples by David G. Lewis, PhD

David G. Lewis is an enrolled tribal member and Tribal Historian of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde. His ancestry is Chinook, Takelma and Santiam Kalapuya.

While in the PhD program in Anthropology at the University of Oregon, he was the Director of the Southwest Oregon Research Project. David completed his PhD in March 2009. His dissertation is "the Termination of the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Community of Oregon; Community, Politics and Identity".

His research areas are American Indian History and Culture, Pacific Northwest Coast Ethno History, Indigenous Sovereignty, and the Federal Termination of Oregon Tribes.

The Beaverton Historical Society's Monthly Presentations are held at the Beaverton History Center on the 2nd Tuesday of each month, 7 - 8pm. They are open to the public and free of charge - donations welcome.

Harmony Exhibit at Art On Broadway

The featured show at Art On Broadway during the month of June highlights nine watercolor and/or acrylic paintings by Donna Sanson based on images from the Portland Japanese Gardens along with numerous Japanese style ceramic vessels created by Jim Johnstone. The show is entitled "Harmony" and will feature an Artists Reception on Saturday, June 8, from 6 to 9 p.m. Complimentary refreshments will be served. The exhibit will continue through June 29.

Jim is one of Art On Broadway's newest member artists and describes his ceramic work as "characterized by refinement and a sense of adventure." He says that "...while I have studied the graphic arts and ceramics of Japan, my pieces reference those traditions without imitating them."

Upon visiting the Japanese Gardens in February, Donna was struck by its tranquil beauty - the simplicity of the quiet spaces spoke to her and asked to be recorded and embedded in her mind. She knew immediately that this planned harmony of rock, water, and plants would become the basis for a new series of paintings.
