- Highland Park Middle School East Hill Improvement Project– Reggie Frumkin
11/9 – blackberries being removed, School District, WashCo, Clean Water Services, Students helped with removal and planted 100 native trees/shrubs, laid mulch down today (donated from Clean Water Services) donated trees to HOA, NAC donated 3 sequoias. Area cannot use herbicides so they will keep coming back. March-May 2017 NAC could organize another dig out blackberries.
Would like to add a plaque/sign to commemorate the project (brown historical marker). Reggie should put the verbiage together and will add to spring agenda.
\$30 expenditure to rent the tool to cut the blackberries

Matching Grants designed to support NACS, yearly \$30k budget. \$3k per project. Refreshes July 1- June 30 is their fiscal. Create sub-committee which has been created. Anna Slatinsky from Beaverton City Planning Division. Permits, development code and updating comprehensive plan for city development. No ETA. Creating housing forum, shortage and increasing real estate prices. Wetland regulations, overarching jurisdiction. Expect information on land use.
