BEAVERTON, Ore. – Beaverton City Library will host a “Lost and Found” themed Story Slam on Thursday, Jan. 11 from 7 to 8:30 p.m. The friendly, open-mic storytelling competition will occur at the main library located at 12375 SW 5th St.

Potential storytellers will put their names in a hat; names will be picked from the hat and those chosen will take to the stage to tell their true, personal, 5- to 8-minute story. Members of the community ages 13 and older are invited to come put their name in the hat to tell a story, which must be told from memory.

The winner of the competition will receive a \$10 Book Corner gift certificate. Potential storytellers should arrive 15 minutes prior to the event start to speak with the event host about their planned story.
