To participate, kids and teens must first sign up online at www.BeavertonLibrary.org/SRP or in person at Beaverton City Library Main (12375 SW 5th St) or the Murray Scholls branch (11200 SW Murray Scholls Pl.) by Jul. 23.

Kids and teens (from birth through grade 12) can read, be read to or listen to audiobooks for a total of 15 hours. Participants keep track of time spent reading fiction, non-fiction, eBooks, comic books, newspapers, magazines or blogs. After completing 15 hours of reading, participants can return to the library between Jul. 9 and Aug. 19 for a free paperback book and a folder full of coupons for free food and activities.
