High Rise fire operation training- working with Nike to train in their new buildings

Station 55 Hidden Springs Road and Rosemont just opened up in July

Station 39 Rivergrove scheduled to open summer 2019

Two new fire engines on order, hoping they will get one (one of their trucks is 12 years old)

Internship program – one year volunteer position, going to college taking fire science courses, Starting on 24<sup>th</sup> of Sept for a 9 month program, they get invited to through testing process, working 24 hour shifts

Local Option Levy – TVFNR seeking renewal in May 2019. Not an added tax; just the 2014 tax is expiring in 2019. Represents 22% of funding, if it is not renewed before June 2020 there will be reductions in resources and staffing. Consulting agency Campbell and Delong will be gauging public opinion and presenting to city boards

Question asked about encouraging women to be involved in becoming a firefighter – women's event over the summer, and increasing diversity is part of the strategic plan for TVFNR

Burn ban lifted but still not allowed to burn yard debris in Beaverton – 3 feet wide 2 feet high allowed

Check your smoke detectors. In our fire district, all of the fire fatalities that have happened were in homes that did not have working smoke detectors.

National Organization celebrating 30 years this year

Began here in June 2016, began helping first family in April of this year

Help homeless families in Beaverton School District (last address is within school district)

Day center is at Sunset Presbyterian (leased space), providing laundry, shower, a mailing address and Case Management

Working with community partners for families to have places to go from 5pm to 7am

Most partners are churches/houses of worship, as well as THPRD and the City

Locations provide dinner, breakfast and sack lunch

Community members can come volunteer to spend time with residents, play games, eat dinner

30 individuals helped since April- total of 9 families

This week the City is hosting families at the Community Center – some staff and some board members are volunteering

Next volunteer opportunity when hosted with the City is in October
