BEAVERTON EXTENDS CITY CLOSURES THROUGH SUNDAY, MARCH 29 IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19

BEAVERTON, Ore. – The City of Beaverton has announced that the closure of all city buildings will remain in effect through Sunday, March 29.

This includes City Hall, the Griffith Drive Building, both library locations, and other city buildings. Essential services such as police, public works, the Beaverton Severe Weather Shelter, and some other critical services will continue operations.

Buildings are expected to open Monday, March 30. Closures will be extended as required.

“Beaverton remains open for business and we’re doing everything we can to provide necessary services and remote options,” said Mayor Denny Doyle. “It is important that we all act responsibly, do what we can to get ahead of this situation, and take time now to plan for future city operations.”

The city has cancelled all non-essential events and meetings through at least April 10.
